Mathematics	 Candidates should at least possess the knowledge and skills learnt in Secondary Mathematics Express Syllabus. These include: Number and Algebra Examples: numbers and their operations; ratio and proportion; percentage; rate and speed; linear and quadratic expressions, formulae, graphs and equations Geometry and Measurement Examples: angles, triangles and polygons; mensuration; congruence and similarity; Pythagoras' theorem and trigonometric ratios in right-angled triangles; properties of circles 	 Candidates will sit for a 1hr 15 min written paper Use of an approved scientific calculator is expected
Science	 Candidates should at least possess the knowledge and skills learnt in Secondary Science Express Syllabus. These include: Diversity Examples: physical properties; chemical composition; separation techniques Models Examples: ray model of light; model of cells; particulate nature of matter; atoms and molecules Interactions Examples: applications of forces and transfer of energy; transfer of heat energy and its effects; chemical changes; interactions within ecosystems Systems Examples: electrical systems; human digestive system; transport systems in living things; human sexual reproductive system The Scientific Endeavour Examples: scientific phenomena, facts, concepts and principles, scientific inquiry skills, scientific technological applications 	 Candidates will sit for a 1hr 15 min written paper Use of an approved scientific calculator is expected

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
