Presented by the National Youth Council, the Singapore Youth Award winners were selected from more than 115 nominees. They were honoured for enriching the lives of others and those of the communities they influence, as well as bringing distinction to the nation.

#### **INAUGURAL PERL SYMPOSIUM 2014**

On 25 July 2014, the RGS Centre for Pedagogical Research and Learning broke traditions of a conventional symposium by opening up the school's classrooms to teachers from other schools to have them experience and observe the RGS teacher in action, student interactions and class dynamics. This was in a move to nurture professional discourse within the educational fraternity through the sharing of effective pedagogical practices and peer observation. The second part of the symposium saw participants attending a keynote address by Professor Lee Wing On, Dean of Research Education at the National Institute of Education, and also concurrent sessions on effective pedagogical practices conducted by presenters from both educational and noneducational institutions. The symposium saw a turnout of over 300 participants, and included educators from both local and overseas institutions.
