Launch of the RGS F1 Centre for Innovation

Launched on 28 July, the RGS F1 Centre for Innovation is the first F1 Centre for Innovation set up by a girls' school. The Centre will serve as a hub for schools to collaborate and explore new ways of providing students with the skills and competencies in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics education through integrated curriculum and meaningful real-world application. The event was graced by Guest-of-Honour, Mrs Ng Ai Lin, Zonal Director, School South, Ministry of Education, and attended by school leaders and teachers from primary and secondary schools in Singapore.

A Memorandum of Understanding was also signed between RGS and the Institution of Engineers, Singapore (IES). With the MOU, RGS and IES will work in collaboration, through the programmes offered by the RGS F1 Centre for Innovation, to promote engineering education and careers, especially among girls.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Top of the World

Singapore sailors swept all the medals on offer at the Optimist World Championships in the Dominican Republic. RGS girls Yukie Yokoyama and Jessica Goh were part of the victorious Singapore team. Yukie was also crowned overall world champion, only the second Singaporean to claim the honour and Jessica claimed 3rd placing. The achievement is no mean feat as the waves were choppy and the competitive field was strong, going up against more than 200 of the world's top 15-and-under Optimist sailors. As Yukie commented, "the waves really affected the balance of my boat so my agility was put to the test the whole way through. Being a world champion feels pretty awesome, it hasn't quite sunk in yet."

Singapore, checked. The region, next.

The inaugural Singapore leg of the prestigious Steinway Youth Piano competition (which concluded on 23 June) saw RGS' own See Ning Hui (407) emerge as champion in the competition and move one step further to attaining the honour of being the first South-East Asian representative at the International Steinway Festival in Hamburg on 7 September. For that honour, Ning Hui will pit her skills against winners from Brunei, Indonesia, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand and Vietnam. Whatever the result, we know that Ning Hui will give her best and do Singapore proud.

Another first by RGS girls

The 23rd International Biology Olympiad (IBO) held in Singapore ended on a high note on 14 July, with Singaporean students coming up tops in the prestigious competition.

RGS alumni Zhang Hui Ting and Mao Haitong (both from class of 2010) were two of the four Singapore representatives who won Gold medals at the competition. The Singapore team obtained a total of four gold medals, placing first in a field of 236 of the brightest and best students from 59 countries. This is the first time Singapore has placed first in the competition.

A Silver finish

RGS Symphonic Band clinched the Silver medal at this year's Singapore International Band Festival, Division 1 category, going up against a competition that consisted mainly of tertiary students.

The competition, held at The Republic Cultural Centre, Esplanade Concert Hall from 18 to 23 July, enabled band members to demonstrate their potential and creativity. Congratulations to all the girls in the band, the instructors and the teachers for this achievement at an international level.

Round the world in...

The Singapore team contesting the 2011-2012 Clipper Round the World Race notched a podium finish after over 50 weeks and 40,000 nautical miles around the globe. RGS alumnus Sherlyn Chen, just 19 years old, who was constantly one of the top students in RGS and who decided take a gap year to represent Singapore in the race completed the full circumnavigation, a feat to be proud of. Taking it one step further, Sherlyn decided to use the race to raise funds which she would donate to a cause that makes education more accessible to children. Just her way of contributing back to a society that has given her so much.
