A total of 31 students and 4 teachers will be travelling in the contingent.

The Year 1 students immersed themselves in the activities and benefitted from the experience as they became more aware of the UGs and Total Defence. The event ended with students learning and singing a Total Defence Song, which helped to remind all that we should be ready to defend and protect our country.

Make a Difference with Climate Change

Despite being the youngest group competing in the Upper Secondary / Junior College / ITE category, they took home the Merit Prize with their project titled 'Powerplant'. As part of the judging requirement, the girls produced a prototype solar-powered, portable smartphone charger, thereby reducing CO2 emission in tackling climate change. The prize presentation took placed on 19 February 2013 at the MND Auditorium.

The National Climate Change Competition 2012 is organised by the National Climate Change Secretariat (NCCS) and supported by the Ministry of Education (MOE), the National Youth Achievement Award Council (NYAAC) and Ngee Ann Polytechnic (NP). The competition aims to inspire Singaporeans to take action for climate change. Through the competition, students gain deeper understanding of climate change, its impact and the importance of individual actions to address the issue.

It's all about Geography

In the annual **NUS Geography Challenge 2013**, RGS students Sarah Lim (401), Thet Thiri Ko (401), Vanessa Chen Hui En (401) and Pan Yu Yu (409) came in 2nd in the Preliminary round - South zone. The girls had to complete MCQs and a creative component question in the qualifying round. One of the students, Thet Thiri Ko, was ranked 5th in the 'Individual Best' category. The girls were one of the top 40 schools to proceed to the finals. They emerged as 1st Runner Up Overall for the Competition, and won 2nd prize in the Geo Trail component, an Amazing Race-like competition around Singapore.

RGS students Yang Yuxiu (313), Shang Mengge (312), Leong Yih Shan (312) and Grace Fu (313) recently took part in the **3rd Eco-Design Challenge 2013**. This competition is organised by the NUS Architecture Department, ACJC, and HDB and the theme for the competition is "Ageing in Place, the Eco way". The girls had to create a model, and a poster accompanied by a write-up. On the day of the finals, the girls gave an oral presentation of their idea to the judges. In the end, the team won Silver in the upper secondary division and 1st Runner Up for the Upper Secondary division (School Award).
